Carlyle Lowell Hagen, age 87 of San Diego, California, passed away on Thursday, February 28, 2019 in San Diego, California. Carl's career spanned 45 years as an Electronics Engineer for General Dynamics and as a Telemetry data professional until retirement in 1995. He processed data from the mission that launched two Mars Landers in 1976 as well as telemetry data from launches of the spacecraft that returned pictures from Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus and Neptune. Carl remained an active ham radio operator Call Sign W6ZST since 1947, enjoyed traveling, birdwatching, bowling, investing in the stock market and gardening. Carl will be remembered fondly for his love of documenting gatherings of both family and friends via both still photos and videos. The family will receive friends from 4:00 to 8:00 pm on Saturday, March 9, 2019 in the Longfellow Slumber Room of Greenwood Mortuary.
