At a young age the family moved to San Diego, where she attended school and graduated from San Diego High School. Soon after graduation she was married to LaZetta LiDrazzah Sr. After a long marriage and 6 children, she became widowed. She was a loyal worker for the U.S. government on North Island Naval Air Station and retired from her position as a data processor in 1982. She was one of the original members of the Beacon Light SDA Church and became an active member when they built the 31st St SDA Church under the pastorate of Dennis T. Black in San Diego, Ca. After serving in several church positions, she became a member of the Oak Park SDA Church, which later became New Hope SDA Church in San Diego, Ca.
