All of us children have deep regret that we have not been able to find a clone of Erin Lane on which to raise our children. Dad will be missed by all that knew him, but most especially by his family. We know that he is in a better place and has been rejoined with the love of his life, whom he has been without since November 3, 2005. But we will always regret that we didn't have more time with him. He is survived by; his brother, Tom Oldfield of Escondido; his oldest son, James Oldfield of Escondido; his only daughter, Cheryl Oldfield Cook, her husband Jason of Vista, his granddaughters Kaitlin Cook of Vista and Cassandra Cook Porrazzo and his great-grandson Nicholas Porrazzo of Murrieta; and youngest son, David Oldfield, his wife Karin and his grandson Daniel of Wildomar.
