It was leaning over and you couldn't see the street signage clearly. On Thursday, I think it was, I noticed it was standing erect and it looks like the signs with the street names are new. It made me very happy to see them repaired. I'd meant to call the city but kept forgetting. Maybe my Uncle had it handled — I'd like to think he did anyway. I pointed it out to my mom when I brought her home from work. And we sat in the truck looking at them for a minute when my mom said "the Railroad and the University, two institutions that helped build Laramie." And that was so profound to me. That is what built this town. And a town is built of people and families. My family in particular was nourished in body, mind and spirit because of these two entities that continue to this day to provide more families with the same nourishment. As I looked at the sign I see the Railroad name is above the University name, and I thought how appropriate. First the railroad then the university. This is a crossroads, a new beginning. The railroad marked a new beginning for many people looking to improve their lives and later the University of Wyoming would bring about new beginnings for more people. The UW started its life on land deeded from the railroad to the city of Laramie. University Avenue started out as Center St. with the intention that this would be the main avenue in the town. It later was renamed University Avenue. So my Uncle Rodger met my Aunt Jenni here in Laramie where their roads crossed one another. My Aunt growing up as a railroad kid, and my Uncle attending the University of Wyoming where he earned his degree in Geology.
