Lois married the love of her life, Bill Lancaster October 27, 1984. She embraced all of Bill's 6 children as her own.

Lois loved kids and related so well to them. She was the most special and fun aunt, not only to her five nieces, but to many neighborhood kids, too, all of whom called her Aunty Lois. She enjoyed and had such a gift for engaging with people of all ages. She was interested in their stories, remembered them, the names of their family members, and even their birthdays.
